

MotorSports NT Charter

To ensure that motor sport in the Northern Territory is carried out in a manner which secures and enhances the safety of participants, officials, spectators and the public and which allows the sport to be competitive and fair.

To promote and protect motor sport within the relevant national rules in relation to the varying types of motor sport conducted throughout the Northern Territory.

To coordinate and guard the interests of Affiliated Clubs and actively encourage Affiliated Clubs to be involved in the business of the Association and ensure the application of Good Governance principles are enshrined as part of the clubs' culture and values.

The Board is collectively responsible for ensuring the Association complies with the Act and regulations made under the Act.

The responsibility of the Board under clause 33(2) for ensuring compliance with the Act includes meeting the requirements of Part 5 of the Act and regulations made for that Part relating to –

- (a) the keeping of accounting records;
- (b) the preparation and presentation of the Association's annual statement of accounts; and
- (c) the auditing of the Association's accounts.

Each Board member must be familiar with the Act and regulations made under the Act. The Board is collectively responsible for ensuring the Association complies with the Act and regulations made under the Act.

A Board member must at a minimum have significant demonstrated experience as a motor sports administrator of an affiliated club or skills sets as determined by the board from time to time and reflected in position descriptions and relevant policy
